Investigations reveal no major pathology, however the patient describes the pain as deep seated, shifting and sometimes associated with burning sensations.
 - i. Explain the psychopathology of pain in this case by highlighting the role of the psycho-neuro-endocrine axis.
 - ii. Give your miasmatic understanding, how can miasmatic understanding aid in the selection of an appropriate homoeopathic remedy for this patient.
